Good day Benjamin.

You are under the false impression that you as a Mohawk can not vote. That is incorrect. Band council identifications is on the list of acceptable id to vote, and the right was granted in 1960 (should have been since confederacy, but lets move forward.)

If the property is a designated Reserve, like the Glebe lands, then you are correct, no taxes would be payable, but then city services would not be accessible either.

Brantford gets the jurisdiction to tax from the Province and they from the Federal government.

When you purchase land within the city of Brantford you sign a document of land transfer, Transfer/Deed of Land Form 1 - Land Registration Reform Act issued by the Province of Ontario. By signing it you are agreeing that the Province of Ontario is overseeing the land. If you don't sign it the land does not get transferred, so it is your choice.

Now the Province delegates responsibilities to the Municipality for providing local services, if the land is not within a incorporated municipality the tax is charged by the Provincial Land Tax Office and service are a provincial matter. Upon signing the Land transfer agreement you have entered a covenant with the Province. You agreed to the bargain, property (not personal) taxes for services.

Now if you can get the property transferred to a reserve then taxes would not apply anymore, but then the city would be not be required to provide services, as taxes pay the services. I would hope a fair agreement could be made so that does not happen.

I don't follow where property taxes impact your Mohawk Civil Liberties, as you agree by purchase to be held accountable to the Province for the property. You want the service provided by the

municipality you need to pay the taxes that pay for them. Could the taxes be less, again another story.

I watched your 91 Spring street video and if the person had not failed to pay the mortgage as per the property owner and the Bank agreement no issue would have happened. The mortgage document would have had provision that disputes are settled in Ontario court, and by signing the agreement the person is **giving** jurisdiction to the Court of Ontario, which the Sheriff had proper documentation of. The person had the choice to sign or not, and they chose to be subject to the Court of Ontario, in that instance. Is it sad someone was evicted? Yes it is heart wrenching, and should be as a last resort. Could the owner have negotiated to have it with a Native court not the Provincial court, probably not, but again it was their choice to sign.

You are responsible for your agreements, as I am. Once signed, you agreed to the jurisdiction, in this case Ontario's jurisdiction. Just the same as I did when I signed my mortgage.

For 50 years the BASR had talked about using a bit of the Glebe lands and there was even a deal to do it at one time, but the city failed to fulfill the build requirement and the deal died. The BASR has raised it head again, and as always touches the Glebe lands.

Personally I would love to see it built, but with the arrangement that Brantford builds the infrastructure to allow Native housing to be built on the native land and it would fairly benefit both of communities.

I would see that as not taxable land as it is still a reserve, but a agreement to provide service for access for the expressway. Each side wins, and maybe someday we will not see sides, but just our neighbours.

I look forward to a long conversation with you, and maybe at the end we will become friends, if not I will at least see your perspective more clearly.

I've had the opportunity to meet with many of the past municipal representatives, some at my home, and some I have met on social media and through some meaningful conversations, it has come to my attention that the common Canadian is generally confused about the nationality and citizenship of the Mohawk Peoples.

This letter is an appeal to your conscience so that you may look not just to the public opinion to understand who the Mohawk are. If you listen to the Canadian public opinion, you may hear that Brantford is a 100% Canadian environment (<https://tworowtimes.com/news/local/haudenosaunee-land-sold-without-consultation>).

Canadians that I have spoken with believe that Mohawk citizens are somehow entitled to participate within the municipal elections, yet, evidently, as a non-Canadian citizen, the Mohawk people do not qualify to vote or become elected in municipal elections. (Municipal Elections Act 1996 12(3), 17(2)(b))

Under the veil of the secret vote the common Canadian and even the municipal councils presume that 100% of the people both Canadian and Mohawk have participated, assuming undelegated authority and jurisdiction over the Mohawk People. The illusion and paradox created from the secret vote cannot mask the truth of my citizenship to the Mohawk nation, and it must not be confused as a granting or waiver of my Mohawk Civil liberties to the municipal corporations.

I started the Brantford Tax Project (<https://www.brantfordtax.com>) to assert my rights to freedom from tyranny, to date the Corporation of the City/Town of Brantford has arbitrarily made claims that Mohawk are the same as all other Canadians, and that I will be levied and taxed the same as any other nationality.

In a reply to an Open Letter sent to the council; Council-person Greg Martin represented the following claims, and in addition my response to Greg Martin (<https://tworowtimes.com/opinion/open-letter-corporation-city-brantford-council>):

July 30 2017, City of Brantford (Councilor Greg Martin):

"Mr. Doolittle, the City of Brantford levies property taxes on property owners regardless of nationality, if you purchase property in Brantford you will be taxed as a property owner the same as any Canadian, American, German, Mohawk, or any other nationality. I hope this helps you better understand our tax system."

July 30 2017, Benjamin Doolittle:

"Thank you for your reply which in total is empty and meaningless (vox et praeterea nihil), however the onus is on you to prove your claim. Mr. Martin and others, please provide evidence as proof that the taxation or levies are lawfully applied (and How) to the Mohawk as you claim "regardless of nationality" which is a very arbitrary statement and lends to my points. Your hopes that I understand the tax system further is confusing because you either ignored or forgot to include any evidence how the property tax is lawfully applied to "Canadian, American, German, Mohawk, or any other nationality."

The Brantford Tax Project Mission reads in part, "...the Corporation of the City of Brantford (herein "Brantford") to provide evidence how the Property Tax and Levies are Lawfully Applied to the Mohawk Nation or Mohawk Individuals (For example Letters Patent, Royal Sign Manual, Warrants, Treaty etc:). Upon a failure of Brantford to produce evidence of their claimed authority that Brantford abandon all claims against the Mohawk People, and that all unilaterally foisted obligations are void from the beginning, the mission includes the restoration of all Mohawk Estates, and the complete reversion (Status Quo Ante Bellum) of any and all non representational taxation including any and all unjust enrichments...."

It is my understanding that The Corporation of the City/Town of Brantford has claimed that Mohawk Peoples have a (municipal) civil obligation to pay property taxes to the Corporation regardless of my own Mohawk Civil Liberties, I have no records or evidence that The Corporation of the City/Town of Brantford lawfully applies its corporate policies and bylaws onto the Mohawk Peoples, and I believe no such records or evidence exists.
